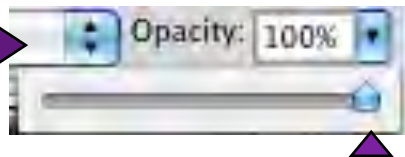

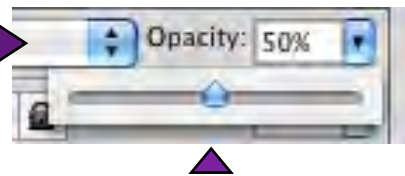
Special Effects -

Changing the Opacity of an image/object

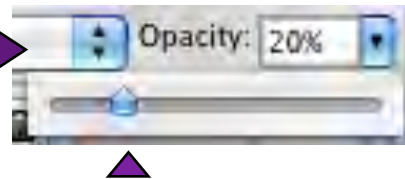
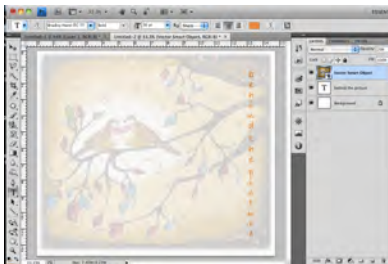
You can change the opacity of an image or object to change the look of your design. You will find the opacity at the top of your 'Layer' window. By changing the opacity you can make earlier layers visible through adjusted layer. Go to 'Opacity', click on the side arrow, a percentage slide will appear. you can move the blue triangle along the slide or type the percentage where the number appears.



This picture is at 100%

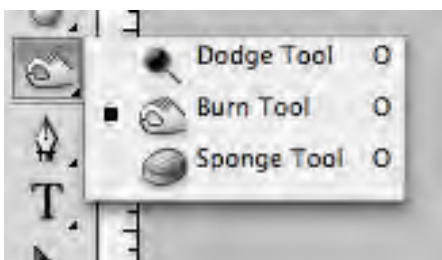


This picture is at 50%. You can see the underneath layer through the picture. The colours appear paler.



This picture is at 20%. You can see the underneath layer well through the picture. The colours appear very pale.

Using the 'Dodge' & 'Burn' tools



The 'Dodge Tool' lightens existing colours. This creates highlights

The 'Burn Tool' darkens existing colours. This creates shadows

The 'Sponge Tool' also darkens the existing colours creating shadows.

Image after applying 'Dodge' & Burn Tool tonal effects

By using the 'Dodge Tool' to lighten the base colour and the 'Burn & Sponge Tools' to darken the base colour, Tonal effects were added to the original 2 dimensional apple shape to make it look 3 dimensional. The tonal effects give the flat 2 dimension shape a more realistic 3 dimensional form.
